Meet our Matchup: Air Force Falcons

Air Force won four of its last five games en route to a 7-5 season and its fifth straight bowl game. The Falcons won their second-straight Commander-in-Chief Trophy with a 24-14 victory over Army and a 35-34 defeat of Navy in an overtime thriller. Falcons quarterback Tim Jefferson spearheads the nation's second-ranked ground attack, which will need to produce in order to keep pace with the high-powered Toledo offense.



Meet Our Matchup: Toledo Rockets

The 8-4 Rockets have posted back-to-back 7-1 conference records, and earned a share of the MAC West Division crown with conference champ Northern Illinois. Toledo's offense has made all the difference this season, averaging 53.4 points over its final five games and setting a school record with at least 40 points scored in each.
